**WBL 111 & WBL 115: The semester prior to co-op consideration, students must meet with their faculty program advisor to obtain approval before registering for classes.

Students are **strongly encouraged** to take SAB 220 Group Techniques/Therapy in addition to the above classes.

Students are encouraged to meet with a Human Services Department Faculty Advisor before registering for courses in the Substance Abuse Certificate.

This Certificate is designed for individuals who already hold a degree in a Human Services related field. The certificate **assists** students in **meeting the SAB educational and practice requirements** for Certification and/or Licensure for the North Carolina Addictions Specialist Professional Practice Board (NCASPPB). Students who do not have an Associate's degree, Bachelor or Master's degree in a Human Service related field are not likely to obtain employment as a Substance Abuse Counselor with only the Substance Abuse Certificate.

Students need to contact the NCASPPB for additional Certification/Licensure requirements.

This program planning guide is for advising purposes and is subject to change. Only the Registrar can clear students for graduation.
