

As a limited enrollment program, the Medical Lab Tech program has a selective admission process. Please make sure you have met all requirements below before submitting your Medical Lab Tech program application.

- Complete Wake Tech application process at apply.waketech.edu
- AP/CLEP scores:** Submit *official* AP or CLEP scores for credit, if applicable.
- Submit required educational transcripts.** Once received, your file will be reviewed for admissions and course placement. If you have college transcripts, verify transcripts are evaluated. Log in to WebAdvisor. Go to Current Curriculum Students → Plan and Register → My Progress. If your course is not there, please email tranevalreq@waketech.edu *It is the student's responsibility to follow up with Student Records for transfer credit.*
- Meet Math proficiency with one of the following:** *(Must be within 10 years of MLT program application date)*
 - Meet the NCCCS high school GPA waiver to be able to take MAT 143 without co-requisite
 - Meet appropriate scores on placement test (ACT/SAT/TEAS/CPT/GED/HiSET) to be able to take MAT 143 without co-requisite
 - Complete MAT 143 with a "C" or better
 - Provide proof of completion of an associate's degree or higher
- Meet English/Reading proficiency with one of the following:**
 - Meet the NCCCS high school GPA waiver to be able to take ENG 111 without co-requisite
 - Meet appropriate scores on placement test (ACT/SAT/TEAS/CPT/GED/HiSET) to be able to take ENG 111 without co-requisite
 - Complete ENG 111 or equivalent with a "C" or better
 - Provide proof of completion of an associate's degree or higher
- Meet Chemistry proficiency with one of the following:**
 - High school or College Chemistry course with a minimum grade of "C"
 - CHM 090 or 092 or equivalent with a minimum grade of "C"
 - Successful completion of Wake Tech's chemistry tutorial (CheMOOC)
- GPA requirement:** Wake Tech pre-MLT program GPA must be a 2.0 or higher to submit application.
- Submit Medical Lab Tech program application. All of the above requirements MUST BE COMPLETED by the application deadline:**
 - Application deadline May 15 for Fall MLT entry

Priority Admissions Process

To select applicants for the Medical Lab Tech program, Wake Tech uses a priority admission procedure – NOT a waiting list. The admission procedure for MLT is a two-part process utilizing both a first-come, first-served process and class completion. This procedure is used if there are more applicants who have met the minimum admission requirements (MAR) than there are available program spaces (24 seats). Those applicants with the most general courses classes (i.e. ENG 111, BIO 163, and CIS 110) completed with a “C” or better and with the earliest program application submission date will be selected for the available MLT seats.

- To receive credit for BIO 163, the class must be completed within 5 years of the first MLT class.
- To receive credit for MAT 143, the class must be completed within 10 years of the first MLT class.
- Please note that for Health Science programs, grades of “C” or better are required in all program-related curriculum classes.
